## **County recycling program grows**

Drop boxes will be placed at five more sites for residents who don't have curbside pickup.

HAMILTON — The Butler County Department of Environmental Services is expanding its recycling drop-box program to five more sites in Madison, Wayne, Hanover and Oxford townships.

The program, launched in 2006, allows township residents who do not have access to curbside recycling to drop off recyclable materials in designated locations. To date, residents have recycled more than 839,000 pounds of material using the drop boxes.

The drop boxes replace the mobile recycling trailer, which operated one day per month in these townships.

"With the expansion of the drop box program, the county hopes to capture more recyclable material and increase the number of households who recycle," said Butler County Commissioner Donald Dixon.

Commission President Charles Furmon said the county "strategically placed" the new boxes at township maintenance buildings, administrative centers, fire stations and the Oxford Wal-Mart.
